Barnardo's Dads Service, Next Steps - Dads Champions Recruitment



Barnardo's are moving to the next stages of the development of a vision to work towards Newcastle becoming a city of inclusion for Fathers. We are now looking to recruit professional 'Dads Champions' from services citywide.

Being a 'Dads Champion' is not so much of a task, but more of an approach within the service you deliver to ensure Dads are seen, heard, supported, and can sustain engagement with you and your team. We refer to this as the 'Think Dad' vision.

We will be working with our Champions to think about how their service engages Dads, and what provision you offer to ensure they are accessible and inclusive for Fathers. We will also explore assessment tools, and how curious questions can give us more information and connections (with consent). We will look at embedding monitoring tools to keep track of Dads who access services to ensure they don't become hidden or invisible.

As a Champion you will have the 'Think Dad' agenda at the forefront of what you do. You can share this learning with your colleagues and cascade it throughout your teams to ensure a standardised service wide offer.

We can look at modifying service assessment and monitoring tools to help you and your colleagues ask the right questions. We can, as a team, support each other to see what is working well, what could be better and make plans to ensure best practise going forward.

This is an exciting opportunity to be part of a big change, a Citywide concept of 'Father Inclusive Practice' where professionals across the board will have the knowledge and tools to ensure families are considered as a whole.

This way of working will help us further in our strive for better outcomes for babies, young people and their family networks.

WORK EXPERIENCE AT NORTHERN STAGE





Our Work Experience is for anyone aged 14-18 looking to gain an insight into the backstage roles in a theatre. It is one intensive week, with a focus on technical and production.

Participants will be introduced to light, sound, special effects and stage management. They will get the chance to try out different backstage roles in our professional theatre space and will work together to design and produce their own technical installation, which is showcased at the end of the week.

Participants work in groups of 15-20 people from across the North East. The week includes:

- Introduction to lighting including; learning how lights work, rigging them, adding colour, focusing and programme them into the lighting desk.
- Introduction to sound including; setting up a sound system, sound effects, and using the software.
- Introduction to stage management including: marking out; prop making; preparing the book; calling the show.
- Counterweight flying system, masking, operating pyrotechnics, health and safety.

Whilst we attract lots of young people already engaged in theatre it's our mission to attract those who haven't even set foot inside a theatre. If you have students who are good at problem solving, technically minded, work well to deadlines or under pressure, are organized and enjoy learning through doing, then they'll get so much from this week (it's also lots of fun and we won an award for it in 2019!)

Applications are now open for our 2024 Work Experience weeks, which will take place from 8-12th July and 15-19th July. TEACHER TASTER NIGHT


