Many construction companies recruit via Traineeships.

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
National Careers Week

The Aviation Academy Experience

Rod is one of Newcastle College's most experienced engineers and lecturers, and he has developed the two-hour Aviation Academy Experience. It is a STEM-focused initiative unique to schools in our region which combines a tour of our Aviation Academy with a round-robin activity using skills and machinery our Aviation Engineering students use on their courses. This guided tour and induction is designed to give your students an insight into a potential career in aircraft engineering.

The Aviation Academy Experience also meets several of the Gatsby benchmarks of good career guidance, so it is a fantastic opportunity to inspire the young engineers of the future!

About the session

The Newcastle College Aviation Academy Experience is a two-hour session designed for KS4 or KS5 students to introduce them to a potential career in the aviation engineering industry. Tours are delivered on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons for school groups of up to 16 attendees (including staff) at a time.

Please let us know at point of contact whether you will need us to organise transport to and from the Aviation Academy.

Hands-on activities

During the session, Rod will guide a round-robin style activity where each learner gets to try hands-on tasks undertaken by our Aviation Engineering students, such as:

- 1. Dismantling and rebuilding a cylinder head
- 2. Electronics and review
- 3. Removal of ailerons and troubleshooting
- 4. Using tools to learn more about cam-shafts.

Would you like to help construct the future of the North East?

Look no further than the Women into Construction Employment programme! Join us for an information session on **Thursday 19th January, 11am-4pm**, in Newcastle City Library, run in collaboration with key construction and engineering employers;



Women into Construction are working in partnership with Gateshead College and BUILDNE to bring women, who are resident in the North of Tyne, a six-week employment programme, starting 30th January 2023.

Supported by Newcastle City Council, North of Tyne Combined Authority, DWP and six key construction and engineering employers, the six-week programme will include construction-related training including Level 1 Health & Safety, CSCS card and a two-week work experience placement.

During the programme you will hear about potential opportunities with the employers and understand more about roles such as Document Controller, Site Engineer, Project Administration, CAD Engineer and Trade based trainee positions. In addition, 1-2-1 support will be provided by Women into Construction.

The programme is open to all women aged 16+, resident in the North of Tyne region and you must be able to commit to a full-time programme. Full 1-2-1 support will be provided by WiC, including childcare & transport costs.
